OUR IDEAL CANDIDATE must learn quickly and be able to work on multiple tasks at once. Opportunities within this program can include: coordinating aspects of evaluation planning and design; collecting data in the field—may involve conducting interviews, observations or tracking visitors; analyzing data; and writing technical reports that interpret and summarize data.

Applicants should: 1) have a Bachelor's degree and a strong interest in pursuing an academic or career path in informal learning; OR 2) be working on or have a master's degree in museum education/studies, education, environmental science, psychology, anthropology, sociology or a related field and have had some experience and/or course work in evaluation or research design; OR 3) be working on a PhD and have relevant experience and/or course work; OR 4) be a museum professional with 2-3 years of experience seeking to enrich his/her experience in visitor studies. Candidates must hold U.S. citizenship.
